





John Wesley's 22 Questions

We know that Jesus intends that we become disciples. But what does that look like for us daily? Discipleship Ministries of The United Methodist Church features webpages that talk about being "Everyday Disciples." One of those features the 22 questions the members of John Wesley's Holy Club asked themselves every day in their private devotions. These 200-year-old questions (updated to American English) are still relevant for us today.

Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?

Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?

Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?

Can I be trusted?

Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?

Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?

Did the Bible live in me today?

Do I give it time to speak to me every day?

Am I enjoying prayer?

When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?

Do I pray about the money I spend?

Do I get to bed on time and get up on time?

Do I disobey God in anything?

Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?

Am I defeated in any part of my life?

Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?

How do I spend my spare time?

Am I proud?

Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?

Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?

Do I grumble or complain constantly?

Is Christ real to me?

I will readily admit, some of the questions make me feel uncomfortable. Not because they are bad or inappropriate questions, but because I know what the truthful answer is.

Here's the challenge for you and me:

Ask these questions of yourself everyday for the month of March!

If you are really daring, keep a journal and write your answers.


You don't have to share it with anyone.

AFTER A COVID DELAY, ONCE AGAIN, WE'RE SEEKING YOUR SUPPORT FOR CLAYTON'S ARMY

On Saturday May 20 the Pittsburgh Region Cystic Fibrosis Foundation will hold its annual Great Strides 5K Walk to raise money for research to fight cystic fibrosis. Not sure what cystic fibrosis is? Well, briefly it is a rare, genetic, life-shortening disease that makes it difficult to breathe. At present there is no cure for it. At present there are about 40,000 patients in the USA and another 65,000-70,000 overseas. Most patients die before the age of 45.

Once again, we'll be walking as part of Clayton's Army. Clayton Himmler is our nephew. He was born on October 24, 2017 and at 5 years of age, he's looking pretty healthy – largely due to the care his parents (Dale and Jennifer) give him and a new still-experimental drug. Nevertheless, he and his parents have to be very careful about infections. A minor chest cold could send him to the hospital.

The last time we were able to participate, Clayton's Army raised around \$10,000; the total for the Great Strides Walk was around \$300,000 - a little less than before Covid. This year, we hope to do better. Most of the money raised is used for research.

We're asking for your help. It's a 5K walk. Could you donate 20 cents a kilometer (\$1.00)? Or 40 cents (\$2.00)? Or \$1.00 (\$5.00)? Or some other amount?

If you're willing to be one of our sponsors, you could give your donation to Nancy or Dave at church some Sunday. Or you could mail it to us: 201 Mowry Road, Monaca, PA 15061. If you use a check, make it out to Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. On the memo line write "Clayton's Army."

Help us to help Clayton and the other kids have the chance to grow old.

Scout Sunday @ Unionville

On Scout Sunday, a Scouting Quilt was on display in the Narthex. This quilt was made for Alan Morrison by Mildred Carey, a seamstress and quilter from Monongahela, PA. The squares were made from 38 neckerchiefs and 10 t-shirts from Alan's Scouting collection and 8 neckerchiefs from his father, Edwin's collection (as noted).

All 4-part squares are the display corners of four different neckerchiefs. The description listing for each 4-part square starts with the top left and goes clockwise. The single squares are either t-shirts or a singular neckerchief. There are some t-shirt pocket emblems oversewn on some items. Mildred had discretion on what went where to give a good balance of color across the quilt. The red sashing connecting the squares is a Scout print fabric from the early 1960s that Alan's mom had used to make a shirt for Edwin. The binding around the edge is the binding removed from the various neckerchiefs.
