



The SAFE Corner

A few years ago, Unionville created a team that was working on the Safe Sanctuaries policy and program for our church. We took on the name of "Unionville Safe". Much of what was put together has been implemented in the life of our ministries, but COVID stalled out completing the policy. We've picked up that mantle again as we seek to make sure that our children, youth, and vulnerable adults are kept safe in our activities.

The Administrative Council has adopted the newest version of the policy. We recognize that we have more to address to provide the SAFE environment we want. So, more updates to the policy are in the future. We will share a portion of the policy each month in the newsletter as one of the ways to help everyone in the church to know our process to be safe.



Three Basic Rules

At the heart of the "protection procedures" are three basic rules that speak to how we provide supervision of our ministries with children, youth, and vulnerable adults.

- **Two-Adult Rule**: Preferred supervision is two non-related adults in each program space throughout the whole event. Alternatively, one adult in each program space with an adult floater rotating through each program space throughout the event time.
- **Rule of Three**: No adult is to be alone with a singular unrelated youth or child. There should always be at least three people.
- **Five Year Rule**: There must be a Five-year gap between a volunteer and the age-group assigned:

Nursery & Preschool volunteers must be sixth grade or older.

Kindergarten – Fourth Grade volunteers must be ninth grade or older.

Fifth Grade – Eighth Grade volunteers must be 18 or older.

Ninth Grade – Twelfth Grade volunteers must be 22 or older.

These rules are essential to providing ministry in a safe environment. Adult volunteers are defined as 18 and above. Youth volunteers are defined as under 18 with a minimum age of entering 6th grade. Youth are assistants and operate as part of a team with an adult in-charge.

These rules are designed not only to protect children, youth, and vulnerable adults, but also to protect our volunteers and staff as they work to provide these vital ministries.

Clearances are required to be on file in our office for all volunteers 14 years of age and older working with our children and youth. They are good for 5 years. Check with Linda Miller to make sure yours are up to date or for help in getting them.

CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL




least once a month but will be changing movie nights to game nights as we are combining our movie nights and lessons nights into one.

Psalm 91

Those who live in the shelter of the Most High will find rest in the shadow of the Almighty. This I declare about the Lord: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; he is my God, and I trust him. For he will rescue you from every trap and protect you from deadly disease. He will cover you with his feathers. He will shelter you with his wings. His faithful promises are your armor and protection. Do not be afraid of the terrors of the night, nor the arrow that flies in the day. Do not dread the disease that stalks in darkness, nor the disaster that strikes at midday. 
