



PASTOR'S CORNER

It's All About...

When I got married, I learned pretty quickly that it would not work if I thought that life is all about me. Having an instant family, I discovered that for our marriage to work life had to be all about my spouse and my son. As the years have gone by, I am at my best in the marriage when I remember that. And of course, Lois and I often muse that it really isn't about either one of us, it is all about our dog. All you have to do is ask Jo and he will let you know that.

As we grow up (not older) we must learn that life is <u>not</u> all about "me". Part of our Lenten journey to give up something and take on some positive behavior seeks to show us that life isn't about "me".

But then the message of Easter turns that on its head. We discover that the mystery of God's gift of his Son as a sacrifice for our sin **is all** about us. Christ died for us!

We discover that who life is all about is answered in different ways.

When we come together to worship, it is all about God. We come to sing praises to God, to offer our prayers to God, to give our gifts of time, treasure, and talent to God's glory, and to hear a word from God through the scriptures and message. It is all about God!

When we come together in fellowship and study, it is all about us. It is our opportunity to learn more about God's love, to have fellowship with others on the journey, and to grow in our understanding of what it means to be a Christ-follower, a Christian.

When we come together in mission and service, it is all about others. It is our opportunity to live out our Discipleship as we care for the needy and we share God's love.

In truth, our life in faith is like a three-legged stool. For the stool to be the most functional and useful, it needs all three legs to be present and firmly connected. For our faith to be the most functional and useful, it needs all three legs of 'worship', 'fellowship and study', and 'mission and service' to be present and firmly connected. Without all three, like the stool, we become less than God intends.

We gather for worship each Sunday at 9:30 AM.

We offer fellowship and study opportunities through Sunday School for children, youth, and adults after worship each week. On Sunday nights we offer children and youth opportunities from 6:30 – 8:00 PM. On Wednesdays, we have two different studies, one at 10:30 AM and one at 7:00 PM.

We offer a variety of service and mission opportunities, some that meet the needs of our community of faith and our surrounding community, while others meet the needs of people all around the world as we share our time, talent, and treasure.

Of course, nothing about "church" is mandatory. But when we take the opportunity to live out our lives remembering that it is <u>all</u> about God, us, and others, we will discover the depths of what it means to be a Disciple!

The SAFE Corner

The Administrative Council adopted a revised Safe Sanctuaries policy and program for Unionville Church in September 2023. More updates are planned to ensure we provide a SAFE environment for all. Each month we will share a portion of the policy in the newsletter as one of the ways to help everyone in the church to know our process to be safe.



WHY HAVE A SAFE SANCTUARY POLICY?

A) The Biblical Mandate and Mandate from the General Conference

Beginning with the 1996 General Conference of The United Methodist Church, a resolution has been adopted, amended, reaffirmed aimed at eliminating any potential for child sexual abuse in the church. The resolution includes the following statement:

Jesus said, "Whoever welcomes a child welcomes me." (Matthew 18:5). Children are full participants in the life of the church and in the realm of God.

Jesus also said, "As for whoever causes these little ones who believe in me to trip and fall into sin, it would be better for them to have a huge stone hung around their necks and be drowned in the bottom of the lake" (Matthew 18:6). Our Christian faith calls us to offer both hospitality and protection to the little ones, the children. The Social Principles of The United Methodist Church state that "children must be protected from economic, physical and sexual exploitation and abuse." (¶ 162C)

Tragically, churches are not always safe places for children. Child sexual abuse, exploitation, including online, and ritual abuse occur in congregations of all sizes and geographical locations. The problem cuts across all economic, cultural, and racial ethnic lines. Most annual conferences can cite specific incidents of child sexual abuse and exploitation within churches. Virtually every congregation has among its members adult survivors of early sexual trauma.

Such incidents are devastating to all who are involved: the child, the family, the local church, and its leaders. Churches are torn apart by the legal, emotional, and monetary consequences of litigation following allegations of abuse. ...

God calls us to make our churches safe places, protecting children and other vulnerable persons from sexual and ritual abuse. God calls us to create communities of faith where children and adults grow safe and strong.

B) Part of the Baptismal Covenant We Make with Each Child

In all our ministries with children and youth, Unionville United Methodist Church is

committed to demonstrating the love of Jesus Christ so that each child will be "surrounded by steadfast love, ...established in the faith, and confirmed and strengthened in the way that leads to life eternal." (Congregational Pledge 2, United Methodist Hymnal, p. 44)

C) For the Protection of Volunteers and Staff in Case of False Allegations of Abuse

Today's families are busier than at any time in our history, presenting a challenge to find volunteers for our various ministries. Additionally, in today's litigious society, volunteers and staff face an increased risk of false accusations. Therefore, our Safe Sanctuaries policies are designed not only to protect children, youth, and vulnerable adults, but also to protect our volunteers and staff.

PURPOSE

In covenant with all United Methodist Congregations, Unionville United Methodist Church commits to establish this policy and to conduct our ministries to assure the physical and emotional safety and spiritual growth of our children, youth, and vulnerable adults as well as our workers with children and youth. This policy seeks to:

- establish reasonable safety measures when selecting and recruiting workers.
- implement appropriate operational procedures in all areas of programming and care.
- deploy workers with children and youth trained on our procedures and policies.
- provide a clearly defined procedure for reporting a suspected incident of abuse consistent with Pennsylvania law.

The policy is essential to providing ministry in a safe environment and allow us to comply with the requirements of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. This process will ensure that we have adequately identified and documented basic information on our volunteers and paid staff including all the required clearances for volunteering with children and youth or working as an employee of the church. Repetitive training will help make the safety of our children and youth a part of the fabric of our lives.

Safe Sanctuary Training Reminder

Our volunteers and staff working with children and youth are required to take training on an annual basis to stay aware of our *Unionville Safe Policy*. The training is intended for those who volunteer in the nursery, work with children's church, Sunday School teachers, Kid's Club & Youth Group leaders, and Vacation Bible School. **Our next training is being offered at 6:30 PM on Monday, April 15th**.

Unionville Church Camper's Fund

PURPOSE: The Camper's Fund is a ministry established to support the

participation of our children, youth, and "adults with intellectual disabilities" to attend a faith-based summer camp experience or faith-based retreat each year. These include United Methodist or other denominational camps or retreats. This does not include mission trips or non-

residential sport camps.

SOURCE OF FUNDING: Funds received from the blue clothing collection box in the

parking lot are designated to the camper's fund.

Periodically, tips from the Community Breakfast, fish fry, or other events may be designated to the camper's fund by the pastor and fundraising event chair. Other funds may be designated by the Administrative Council at their discretion in addition to any funds specifically designated by a donor.

CAMPER ELIGIBILITY: The camper must be regularly active in Unionville Church's

worship, Sunday school, and/or other age-specific ministries such as Kid's Club and Youth Group.

FUND ADMINISTRATION: Requests for scholarships are to be made in writing to the

pastor who has approval authority to grant the scholarship. The pastor may consult with the Christian Education chair, Lay Leader, and Administrative Council chair, if a question

arises.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT: Based on available funds, the amount of the scholarship

will be up to 50% of the total per person and paid directly to the event registrar once the camper has registered and paid their portion of the cost of camp (as of 2024, camp fees range from \$125 - \$725 depending on host facility, duration,

age-level, and primary program feature).



On behalf of the Conference Treasurer's Office and the Conference Council on Finance & Administration ("CF&A"), thank you for your 2023 Connectional Apportionment giving of \$26,295.00.

We recognize that the last few years have introduced unprecedented change and challenges, and that further change is on the horizon as we <u>all</u> live into our new realities. *Please know that every dollar given towards the Conference connectional apportionment budget is graciously, and thankfully, received. Your faithful giving contributes to our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.*

We understand that some churches continue to struggle financially, and in those instances, we ask that you pray to God for guidance as to what your church is capable of paying and pay that amount; and to not be discouraged if the goal of 100% is not attained. At some point, <u>every</u> church will experience growth, and decline, in their financial vitality. In some years, your church may have been able to pay 100% of their apportionment, effectively bolstering those churches that were unable to do so; in other years, your church may be the one being bolstered. *This is truly a demonstration of our connectional system at work*.
